Friends in Christ:

"We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers..." 1 Thessalonians 1:2

Many of you have probably heard by now that I am preparing to move back to Ohio, to start a new call there and to be closer to my family. I'm excited about this new opportunity, but I miss all of you in Minnesota already!

Thinking about that, I'm reminded that a large part of what we call the New Testament is made up of letters between Christians in different parts of the world. Scholars think that some of these letters were likely written even before the gospels! Letters allowed whole communities to connect with people they cared about across great differences in all sorts of difficult circumstances.

Maybe it's my preoccupation with moving that caused this practice to stand out to me. It seems to me to be evidence that from literally the earliest records we have, it's been part of the regular pattern of Christian life that some people move on and some people stay.

Maybe you've been one of the people who moved on at some point in your life. Maybe the community where you live right now is not where you started out. Maybe you spent some time away, for education or a job or some other reason, and then came back. Or maybe you're a person who has mostly stayed in one place, or who at least is staying put for this season.

Either way, you can experience both challenges and opportunities. It's difficult to go to a new place, to learn new rhythms and form new relationships, but it's a gift to have a fresh start. It's also difficult to stay in one place and say good-bye, to have to work things out where you are, but it's a gift to be able to deepen and depend on existing relationships.

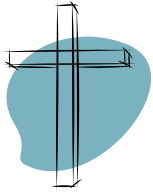
The Body of Christ has room in it for all of those different experiences. The differences are not just accepted; they are valued! In fact, if it wasn't for this dynamic—some people leaving, others staying—we wouldn't even have some of the most beloved books of the New Testament.

As I prepare to leave this place, we are separated by more than just physical distance. We're separated by "social distancing" and other precautions that are necessary in a pandemic. We're separated by ideological differences that threaten even our humanity. The letters of the New Testament remind us that those separations don't have to end our relationships. We can still be connected. In Christ, we still *are* connected.

So I'd like to join Paul and his friends in saying, *I give thanks to God for all of you*. You will be in my prayers, as I hope I will be in your prayers. I encourage you to pray for your new pastor, whoever that may be, and for one another. Perhaps someday I'll be back in Minnesota to visit, but whether we see each other again, or not, God will hold us all.
